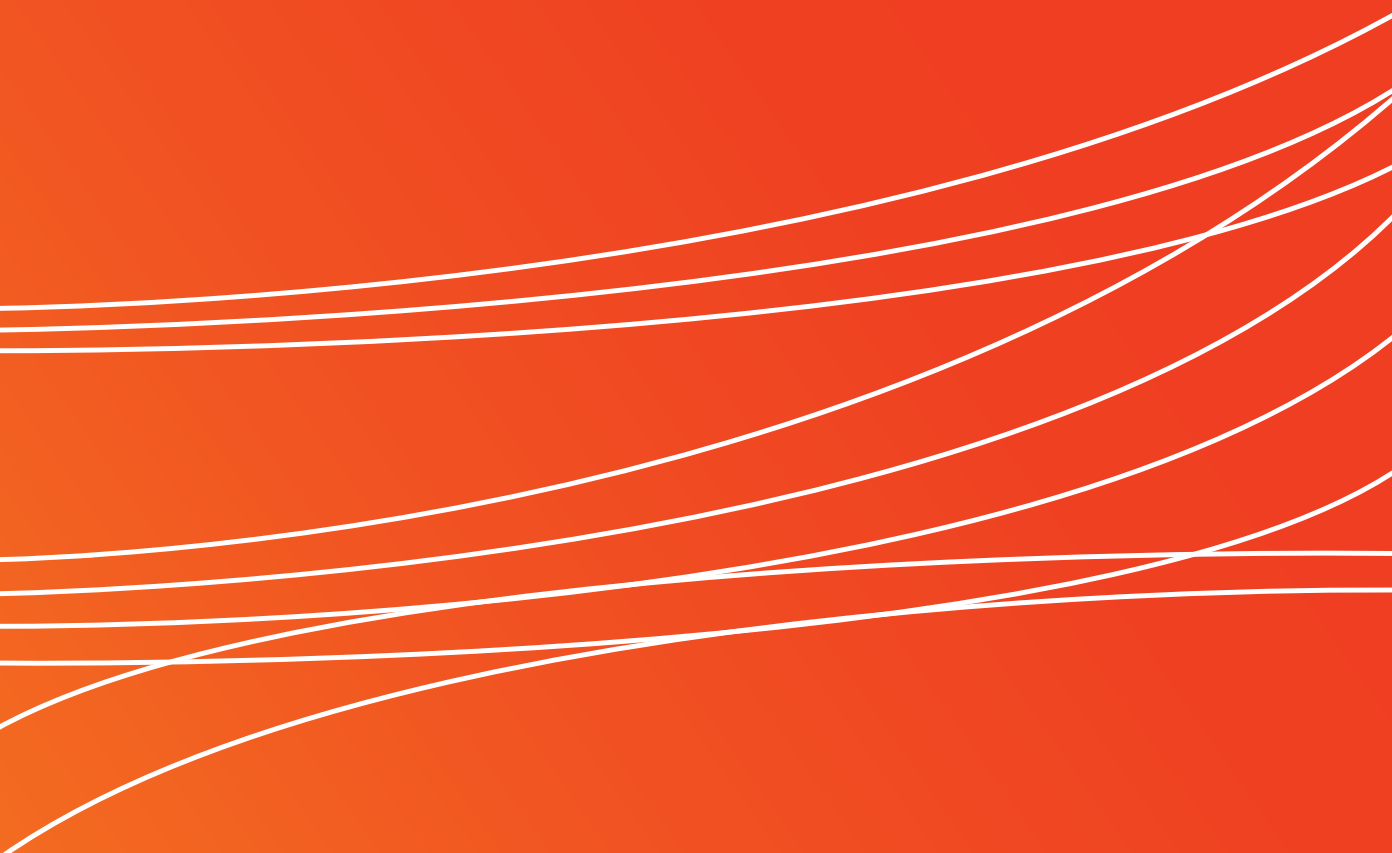

2008 DESIGN AWARDS SCHEDULE & FEES

June 20	Entry fees and forms due by 4 p.m.
July 18	Submittals due by 4 p.m.

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ELIGIBILITY

Any work of architecture in the awards categories of Built Architecture, Unbuilt Architecture, Interiors, Planning, Innovative Architectural Representation or Sustainability, completed since Jan. 1, 2003, regardless of location, may be entered with the stipulation that the architecture was directed and substantially executed by design professionals and/or firms that are members of AIA Colorado. Only the firm-of-record or in its absence, the architect-of-record (licensed in the state of Colorado) may submit entries for this competition. When the architect is not the sole author, all other participants substantially contributing to design of this project must be given credit. Projects that have received awards unassociated with AIA Colorado may be entered in this competition; however, award-winning projects previously submitted are ineligible. There is no limit to the number of entries per firm or architect. All joint venture firms must be identified, and all entrants must sign the disclaimer regarding payment of interns in their office(s).

Non-AIA Colorado members may submit entries provided that they join AIA Colorado by Friday, June 20. Call AIA Colorado at 303.446.2266 to inquire.

CATEGORIES

- **Built Architecture**
- **Unbuilt Architecture** (a commissioned project that has not been or probably will not be built)
- **Interiors** (no sample boards permitted)
- **Planning**
- **Innovative Architectural Representation***
- **Sustainability****

*The Innovative Architectural Representation award is given to the entrant demonstrating the most innovative, artistic and effective presentation of an architectural project. Representative projects could include drawings, renderings, physical models, computer-generated three-dimensional models, animations or other methods.

**The Sustainability award is intended for projects that not only merit recognition for design excellence, but also encompass a philosophy of sustainable design. Projects that make a concerted effort to maximize natural day light, reduce energy consumption, use sustainable materials and maintain high levels of indoor air quality are just a few criteria for selection. Other factors to consider are preservation of the site's natural surroundings, use of the area's natural sustainable resources, reclamation and/or cleansing of impoverished and/or polluted sites, access to public transportation or other demonstrable areas of sustainable design.

AWARDS

The type and number of awards given will be determined by the jury and may include Honor, Merit or Citation. Award winners will receive certificates during the AIA Colorado 2008 Design Awards Gala, on Saturday, Sept. 27, at Vail Cascade Resort & Spa in Vail, Colo. Winners will receive recognition in the winter issue of *Architect Colorado*. In addition, award winners will be featured throughout 2009 on the homepage of AIA Colorado's Web site www.aiacolorado.org. All submittals will be considered for use as a featured project in a future issue of *Architect Colorado*. In recognition of the vital part they play in the creation of these projects, the owner and contractors are invited to participate in the awards presentation. At the architect's request, additional award certificates may be prepared for the owner, contractor and others at a charge of \$40 per certificate. Duplicate certificate requests must be made in writing to the AIA Colorado office by Friday, Dec. 12.

JURY CHAIR

GREG PAPAY, FAIA

Greg Papay, FAIA is managing partner of Lake|Flato Architects. His emphasis on merging the craft and science of architecture creates public buildings and places that are tactile and modern, environmentally responsible and authentic, artful and detailed. Since joining the firm in 1993, Papay has worked on a variety of building types ranging from the \$174 million arena for the San Antonio Spurs to the School of Nursing for the University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston, which was selected by AIA as a 2006 Top Ten Green Project. In recent years, creating architecture for education has become Papay's passion.

Papay's design impact at Lake|Flato is not restricted simply to producing architecture. When he joined Lake|Flato 14 years ago, it was a 12-person firm working on small scale, locally-focused projects. Under Papay's direction as managing partner since 1997, Lake|Flato has grown to a firm of more than 60, with a national focus to its design practice, more than 100 AIA design awards and the AIA 2004 Architecture Firm Award.

Papay's efforts to promote design excellence extend beyond his practice and his region. He has lectured and juried extensively in the past decade, advocating for place-based architecture. He has served as the AIA San Antonio president and was instrumental in planning for the AIA National Convention in San Antonio in 2007. His work has been recognized with five national awards and six state and regional awards.

SUBMITTAL REQUIREMENTS

Each entry must be submitted in a black, hard-back, half-inch thick, 8 ½ " x 11", three-ring binder (provided by the entering firm) with the label affixed to its spine. Nothing can be on the front cover of the binder. Any entry not submitted in a black, hard-back, half-inch thick, 8 ½" x 11", three-ring binder with the label affixed to its spine will be disqualified. The outside of the binder should be completely plain, except for the label. Submittal contents will consist of the following, in the order prescribed:

1. **Project Narrative:** (May be combined with project images.) The project narrative is to be a written description of the project. This narrative should not exceed one page. Clearly identify the project name and category. Be sure to describe the unique aspects of the project. The narrative is one of the most critical parts of the entry. Be certain not to disclose the firm's identity; if a firm is identified, the submittal will be disqualified and entry fees will not be refunded.
2. **Project Data Page:** The project data is limited to one page and must identify only the following: name of project, type of project, project completion date, location, primary materials used, size of building, size of site, cost of construction and scope of work (i.e. goals of the project, special considerations, unique design requirements, etc.).
3. A maximum of 14 pages, single-sided (or seven pages, double-sided) of photographs, drawings and additional descriptive narrative. Within these pages include a floor plan and site plan, if applicable. All pages must be 8 ½" x 11" in size, including floor plans and drawings. Project narrative, drawings, photographs and relevant text may be combined or collaged at the discretion of the entrant.

Note: It is permissible to include photos on the project narrative page and the project data page, however, if photos are included, the pages will count toward the 14-page maximum.

4. **Sealed Envelope:** The binder number should be on the outside of the envelope, and the envelope should contain the following:
 - Project Identification Form
 - Waiver
 - Photo Release Form
 - Intern Disclaimer Form

5. **Project CD:** The project CD must contain the entire contents of the submitted binder in the same order as the pages appear in the binder. All files should be titled with the project name, binder number and page number as it appears in the submittal binder.

Example: Project X #32 Page 2

- Project Narrative, as a Word document
- Project Data page, as a Word document
- Maximum of 14 pages of photographs, drawings and additional descriptive narrative. Photos should be saved as JPEG or TIFF files, at least 300 dpi. All other files should be saved as PDF files.

**Note: Submitted CDs that do not adhere to the above file type requirements will result in the project being disqualified.*

Note: Architect is responsible for obtaining permission from photographer to publish all photos submitted by architect. Winning projects will not be displayed on the AIA Colorado Web site unless permission form is completed. (Permission should be obtained prior to submission by completing the Photo Release Wavier included in the awards packet to be provided by AIA Colorado.)

Note: We recommend that you do not submit the only existing copy of your photographs as there is always a possibility that something may be misplaced during the jury process.

AIA COLORADO 2008 HONOR AWARDS

The AIA Colorado 2008 Honor Awards Committee is now accepting nominations for six honor awards to be bestowed at the Design Awards Gala on Saturday, Sept. 27, including the 25 Year Award, Contribution to the Built Environment by a Non-Architect, Innovative Practices, Leadership, Firm of the Year and Architect of the Year. There is no fee to submit or nominate someone for these awards. The deadline for submissions is Tuesday, July 29.
