



Better Denver Plan: Investing in Denver's Critical Infrastructure

Recently, AIA Denver endorsed Mayor Hickenlooper's Better Denver Plan, a smart and fiscally responsible plan to address Denver's long neglected infrastructure needs: Issues A through I on this fall's vote-by-mail ballot.

The Better Denver Plan will allow Denver to invest in its critical infrastructure, such as streets, parks, cultural facilities and many other amenities within the city. It will also create a dedicated stream of revenue to ensure the maintenance of these assets in the future.

The Better Denver plan includes:

- Major improvements to streets, roads and walkways.
- Updates and improvements to city buildings as well as human services, health care and child care centers.
- Improvements and renovations to police and fire stations.
- Improvements and expansions to our library systems and cultural buildings.
- Improvements to Denver's parks and recreational facilities.
- A new, deferred maintenance fund to take care of such basic municipal maintenance in years and decades to come.
