

James Timberlake, FAIA

James Timberlake is a partner at KieranTimberlake Associates, an award-winning and internationally recognized architecture firm noted for its research, innovation and inventive design. Mr. Timberlake received his Bachelor's degree from the University of Detroit, and his Master of Architecture from the University of Pennsylvania. He is a recipient of the Rome Prize, American Academy in Rome, 1982-83.

Mr. Timberlake is an Adjunct Professor at the University of Pennsylvania's School of Design, and Endowed Professor in Sustainability at the University of Washington College of Architecture and Urban Planning. He has served as Eero Saarinen Distinguished Professor of Design at Yale University, Max Fisher Chair at the University of Michigan, and has taught at Princeton University and the University of Texas at Austin among other institutions.

Kieran and Timberlake were the inaugural recipients of the prestigious Benjamin Latrobe Fellowship for architectural design research from the AIA College of Fellows. In 2008, KieranTimberlake received the Architecture Firm Award, the highest honor bestowed on a firm by the American Institute of Architects.

They co-authored *Manual, The Architecture of KieranTimberlake*, published by Princeton Architectural Press in 2002, and *refabricating ARCHITECTURE*, published by McGraw Hill in 2004, which examines how manufacturing methodologies are poised to transform building construction. Their forthcoming book, *Loblolly House: Elements of a New Architecture*, is a case study of a single building which inaugurates a new, more efficient way of constructing offsite through the use of building information modeling and integrated component assemblies.

Recent projects include the West Campus Residential Initiative at Cornell University, Philadelphia Theatre Company's Suzanne Roberts Theatre, and a housing prototype for the Make It Right Foundation.
