SB07-107 Position Paper  
Concerning the Regulation of Landscape Architects

- Landscape Architecture is an allied profession;
- AIA/C has historically supported the efforts of Colorado Chapter of the American Society of Landscape Architects (CCASLA) in their support of licensure of Landscape Architecture;
- SB07-107 parallels the Colorado Statute language for the regulation and licensure of Architects;
- SB07-107 is essentially the same bill CCASLA passed through the Colorado Legislature last year, HB06-1331;
- AIA/C supported HB06-1331;
- SB07-107 would create an independent Board of Landscape Architects;
- AIA/C has advocated heavily for Landscape Architects to have their own Board, rather than be a part of the Board of Architects, Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors;
- SB07-107 requires similar education, experience and testing requirements of applicants for Landscape Architecture license as required for Architect license applicants;
- SB07-107 does not restrict the practice of Architecture.

In consideration of the above points, be it therefore proclaimed that AIA/Colorado SUPPORTS SB07-107, Concerning the Regulation of Landscape Architects.
