AIA Colorado and AIA Denver Host Exhibit Showcasing Colorado Architecture at DIA

April 1, 2008 (Denver)—The American Institute of Architects (AIA) Colorado component and AIA Denver in conjunction with the Denver International Airport Art Program are hosting the exhibit, “Crossroads: Colorado Architecture Then, Now and Beyond.” The exhibit was installed on March 14 and will be displayed at Denver International Airport until January 19, 2009. The exhibit is located on Concourses A and C.

The exhibit is designed to showcase Colorado’s rich architectural history. Photo and rendering boards as well as architectural models are included in this 90-piece exhibit and features AIA-member architects. Additionally, the exhibit celebrates Colorado Architecture Week (April 11-17) and Denver’s 150th birthday with a historical look at architecture over years with images from Denver Public Library’s collection.

The cost to view the exhibit is free, however, the exhibit is only accessible beyond security checkpoints and only ticketed customers are able to view it.
